This is to Certify that

(1) I *Frederick Fairweather*

recently an inmate of "Dr. Barnardo's Homes," being of the age of 18 years on my last birthday, do hereby acknowledge and declare that I have received from Thomas John Barnardo, of the City of London, England, Founder and Director of the said "Dr. Barnardo's Homes," as AN ADVANCE, the cost of transportation from London, England, to Russell, Manitoba, with maintenance on the journey, and necessary outfit of clothing for the journey, amounting in all to FORTY EIGHT DOLLARS, lawful money of the dominion of Canada, which amount I hereby agree to repay to the said Thomas John Barnardo, or his representatives, in the manner set forth in paragraph 3.

(2) And IN CONSIDERATION of my receiving such advance, and with a view to its repayment as aforesaid, I hereby AGREE TO WORK and to be employed on Dr. Barnardo's Farm at Russell, Manitoba, for a period of ONE YEAR, dating from the first day of April, 1892, to the first day of April, 1893, under the direction, and subject in all things to the orders of the Manager of the said Farm, Mr. E. A. Struthers, Justice of the Peace for the Province of Manitoba, and his Assistants and Officers.

(3) Subject to my conduct and behaviour being satisfactory, and my work and duties being faithfully performed, I understand that I shall, for the above mentioned period of one year, receive, in addition to board, lodging, medicine and medical attendance, WAGES at the rate of SIX DOLLARS per Month for Six Months dating from the first day of April, 1892, to the thirtieth day of September, 1892, at SEVEN

DOLLARS per month for the six months dating from the first day of October, 1892, to the first day of April, 1893, on the understanding and subject to the condition that the sum of FOUR DOLLARS shall be deducted each month from such wages towards repaying the full amount advanced for passage and outfit as herein stated, and a further amount deducted each month to cover the cost of such additional clothing as shall be furnished to me during the year by Mr. Struthers, as I may require it.

(4) I further understand and agree that ALL BREAKAGES and DAMAGE TO PROPERTY caused by myself will be paid for and made good by me from my wages, and will be charged against them by Mr. Struthers.

(5) I further understand and agree that I am subject to be EXPELLED at any time by Mr. Struthers from the Farm Home for insubordination or serious misconduct, but in that case, or in the event of my leaving the Farm Home from any cause whatever, or failing while there to qualify myself to receive sufficient wages to cover the amount necessary to repay the sum still due on account of passage and outfit or clothing supplied by Mr. Struthers, or breakages or damage to property, I shall still REMAIN LIABLE for the amount so left unpaid, and such amount SHALL BE RECOVERABLE from me by Mr. Struthers by the ordinary process provided by law for such recovery.
